

WHERE MONEY IS A NUISANCE

Americans have reason to be thankful for their simple and reliable money. The complications of the Chinese currency are endless: China possesses 72 different money values. As to the money of account, the Kaitung Tael, familiar in connection with the customs, the Hankow, Kuantung, Esanping, Tookwai and others, each differ in varying percentages of the "Hankow" or Chinese money. If a traveler from another country to make an extended tour, passing through the district, where a manifold variety of coins circulate, the constant change from one weight or coin to another would dissipate a very large part of his capital.
