# SUPERPOWER IN RADIO IS USED IN FIRST TESTS

Giant Laboratory of WGY Transmits With Greatest Power Ever Used-Engineers Expect Useful Results.


From the largest and most powerful ansmitting laboratory in the world WGY, of Schenectady, N. Y., has just wor, of Schenectady, N. T., has just broadcast on superpower, using 50 kilowatts on the antenna for the first time in this country or abroad. This laboratory was erected three many broads outside, of Schenectady by the

Jeneral Biectric Company for the pur-bose of making a systematic study of Tansmission phenomena. It is equip-sed for rosearch on wave-lengths from live meters to 3,000 meters with power from five watts to 100,000 watts.

"The laboratory occupies 54 acres of the laboratory occupies 54 acres of 13 buildings, three towers 300 feet high, one tower 130 feet high, and a multitude of smaller towers ranging from 50 to 100 feet in height. From and between the towers is arrafised a newtork of antennas with which we hope to secure randamental data on the most resure randamental data on the most

secure runnamental data on the mose efficient antenna for a given wave-length and power.
