

# Commemorative Coin Completed For Sale



To commemorate the 150th anniversary of Oakland County, the Sesqui-Centennial Committee through C. Hugh Dohany, county treasurer, has prepared for sale a commemorative coin.

The design of the coin is by the internationally known sculptor, Marshall Fredericks, who volunteered his skill to assist in the celebration.

It is the first time in the history of the United States that a local resident of such renown, has designed a coin for his own country.

The reverse side of the coin carries the inscription "Sesqui-Centennial," and the years "1820-1970." Chief Pontiac is featured carrying a pipe of peace. Directly behind Chief Pontiac's head is a full moon, depicting the passing of time or the end of an era.

The design on the other side is a replica of the seal of the county, featuring a noble "white oak tree" with a sunburst behind the tree.

Oakland County derived its name from the great oak tree forests, that the first settlers observed prior to 1820. The white oak tree is known as the

symbol of strength, durability and grandeur.

Thus the coin depicts the passing of one era, the unpoluted water, primeval forests and great natural resources, that belonged to and passed with the Red Man; and the beginning of our own history as symbolized by the sunburst behind the oak tree; and the strength and durability needed to meet the challenge of the future.

**DOHANY ANNOUNCED** that the sale of the coins will begin on June 25th and will be sold only through financial institutions in Oakland County, mainly the banks, bank branches and savings and loan offices. The bronze coins are available for \$1. A silver coin numbered and in a plastic case is available for \$10.

A commemorative set which is in a green leather case with a white satin back and the county seal in gold stamped on satin will consist of one silver and one bronze numbered identically. These sets will sell for \$12.50.

Since there are a limited number of coins available, it is felt that these will not only be a keepsake but will be a collector's item in years to come.

re-election at the end of the third year following their election to membership.

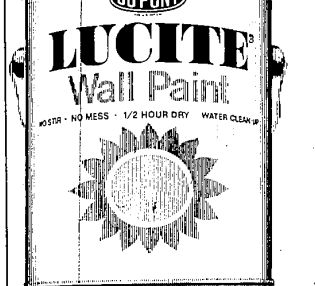
## Finishes Course

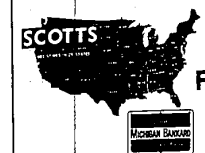
