ADF Features Plays of 1900s

The American Drama Festival features plays from the 19th century, but if it weren't for the 20th century automobile it would have a hard time existing.

If it weren't for Henry Ford and the Museum and Greenfield Village, the festival would have no home of course.

But the automobile contributes to its life in two other important ways...in getting people here to see the shows, and in getting people to Dearborn to pull up the shows.

Fully one-quarter of the odd people involved in the productions are from Oberlyerland, and make the trip back and forth daily.

THERE WILL BE many friends and relatives from the area on hand Thursday, July 2, when the theater opens with "My Partner" in a preview for the press and family of those involved.

"My Partner" will open to the public Friday, July 3, at 8:30 p.m. Sentiment and comedy go hand-in-hand in this med-dramatic story of the friendship of two gold-miners broke by the love of two women.

Plays will be staged Monday through Saturday—evenings through Sept. 12.

"Our American Cousin," Tony Taylor's celebrated eccentric comedy about an American abroad visiting his English cousin, opens Monday, July 13, and will run alternately with "My Partner" until July 25. The play was a favorite of Abraham Lincoln, and he was watching it when he was assassinated.

"A Trip to Chinatown," the only musical in this year's program, will open July 27, and will see the opening of "Sherlock Holmes."

Friends in Farmington will be able to see Louise Divito in "Our American Cousin." A housewife and mother, who has 40 been active in community theater, she plays the role of Mrs. Monteblossington.

Rita from Farmington came two college students, Susan Latham, who was an apprentice last year, has a role in "A Trip to Chinatown," and Deborah Jaffer, who appeared in the winter production of "Rumpelstiltskin," is an apprentice this year.

From Plymouth come David Douglas's and Alice Masson, both in their first year as apprentices and both finishing the ninth grade.

Livonia's lone representative, Jean Stranquist, is also the youngest of the group. She is a student at St. Michael High School, and was also in "Rumpelstiltskin."
