Parcel Post Size Hiked

The parcel post size limit will be increased to 78 inches in combined length and girth for most shipments between first-class post offices beginning July 1.

The weight limit for most parcels sent from one community to other first-class offices will remain at 40 pounds.

The weight and size limits on certain agricultural items as well as parcels sent to or from smaller offices, rural or star routes, military post offices, and all Alaskan and Hawaiian post offices, stay at 70 pounds, with a combined length and girth of 100 inches.

The Postal Service authorized the public service to increase, in five steps, the weight and size limits on shipments between larger cities. When the final step is taken next year on July 1, the size limit for most shipments will be increased to 84 inches in length and girth.

Be Wary Of 'Blow-ups'

Watch out for "blow-ups" on concrete highways on hot afternoons in early summer, the Department of State Highways warns motorists.

The blow-ups occur at pavement joints, usually in late afternoon after a day of intense heat.

Michigan's temperatures have varied from 51 degrees below zero in winter to 112 above in summer.

Concrete expands and contracts under heat and cold so engineers build expansion joints into concrete highways. After a highway has been in use for a number of years, however, moisture, sand, stones and gravel sometimes work into the joint, causing it to "fail" under extreme temperatures. When this happens,
