Russkie Utyok, in the Yakutsk province of Siberia, is one of the northernmost settlements on the globe, and beyond a doubt one of the loneliest. A Russian exile who lived in the province refers to his life in the settlement of six houses and twenty-two people as that of an Arctic Robinson Crusoe. He was 300 miles from the nearest village and 4,000 miles from the nearest railway station. There was, of course, no postal communication. Answers to trivial correspondence could be obtained from Yakutsk, the capital of the province, only by mail.
