The proposed rate increase comes before the first cable shows have been aired in the city and while homes are still being wired for the service, which is expected to be in operation in some homes by mid-January.

In his letter, Harris said all applicants for the Livoola cable franchise knew costs were going to go up and made provisions in their contracts to deal with that eventuality. In Livonia, Harris said MetroVision has to give a 30-day notice of a rate increase.

HE ALSO assured the commission MetroVision is paying the lowest rates available for satellite services.

"All of the increases agreed to have either been implemented in the last six months or will take effect Jan. 1, 1984," he wrote.

Harris called "dramatic" the following satellite service increases: ESPN, from .00 per month to .12 per month; Cable Nets Network and Headline News, .04 per month to .15; MTV, .00 to .10; C-Span, .01 to .03; Weather Channel, .00 to .05; Nickelodeon, .00 to .10; USA Network, .00 to .07; and ARTS, .00 to .06 per month.

HE SAID the increases added up to a 3 per month collective increase for he above services. Harris said he wanted subscribers to

Harris said he wanted subscribers to know now that the increases are coming, rather than wait until the system is operating before telling them.

"We feel the fairest thing to the community, its citizens and the company is to establish a realistic subscriber rate at the start of the service," he wrote. "Then citizens can make their decision accordingly as to whether or not they will be cable subscribers, rather than seiling subscribers at one rate and then having to increase rates shortly thereafter."
