Whether the gross national product goes up or down; whether television is the most pervasive influence in our lives; or whether or not the computer is here to stay, poets continue their ancient tradition of crafting words to evoke the human condition.

Poet and artist Faye Kicknosway maintains that tradition and gives full play to her talents in one long poem, "She Wears Him Fancy in Her Night Braid," published recently by the Toothpaste Press of West Branch, Iowa.

The poem and six original drawings take a deep inward look at a woman's awareness of how tightly love's conflicts are woven into the texture of her life.

In Philadelphia, three centuries ago, a maternal ancestor's mother warns her daughter: "... Pleasure is the Devil's own/and has no place/in a young girl's life./Nor in a wife's./Nor in a mother's."

A May wedding is planned in St. John Lutheran Church, Farmington.



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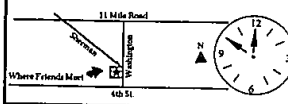
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
