The highest point of unified sound was achieved in Eigar's Eiegy. It featured some of the most refined playing with controlled crescendos.

The most pronounced weakness was in the role of the second violins. This group, which demonstrated some flavs throughout the program, sounded frequently out of tune in this closing selection. But there were some good quali-

tles in the opening Prelude, the Air and the final Rigaudon.

If some of these evaluations seem harsh, it is because this performance is being measured here by the same strict standard that is being applied to pro-fessional orchestras.

As a community orchestra, the Scandinavian Symphony Orchestra certainly possesses a high potential and is among the better groups of its kind. Any group capable of providing an inspiring program even if not consistently perfect, must be on the right path. Occasional misses not withstanding, this group definitely has a good sense of direction.


