elementary school level.

• Two years of a foreign language for college-bound students.

• Better discipline in schools.

• A requirement that teachers in grades seven and eight be certified in their subject areas.

The eight-member state board unanimously passed the plan last Wednesday.

If local boards fail to adopt the state's "recommendations" by 1988, the state board could ask the governor and legislature to require them by law. Some observers have said that this is unlikely, however, because if the state mandates the requirements, it may have to pay for them.

Oakland Community College will offer courses in comparative politics and modern French history in France and Italy from May 11 to June 4.

Deadlines are now being accepted. Final payment is due March 11. Registration for the spring term will be taken May 1. For further information contact Marilyn Finkel at 471-7799, Gerald Faye at 471-7844 or Bede Epstein, 827-1180.

During the six credit hours of instruction, the student will examine the art and political contributions of the Mediterranean world.

Instruction will take place in the classroom, as well as on famous architectural and historical sites. Enrollment is limited to 18 students. The all-inclusive rate for the tour is \$2,325 per person based on double occupancy and full program participation.

The package includes round-trip air fare from Detroit to Rome and from Brussels to Detroit; accommodations in tourist or first-class hotels with a private bath for five nights in Rome, three nights in Florence and four nights in Paris.

Also included are accommodation for 10 nights at the International College in Cannes, France. Each participant will be given a Eurailpass for 21 days of unlimited rail travel in any country in continental western Europe.

There also will be two eight-hour days of touring by private motor coach on the French Riviera and an allowance suitable to cover hotel accommodations in either Paris or Brussels on the night of June 3.


