

# Council will decide on funds to alleviate drain problem

"Yes, it's the priority among the staff," responded Blasz. Although the council eventually agreed to let residents know there is a

good chance Block Grant money will be used in the Tarabusi Gardens, most of the council members at first hesitated.

"It's kind of hard to say this is the project above all projects," said Mayor

Charles Williams. "Not that this isn't a worthy project, but we'd like to see all the projects."

CITY MANAGER Lawrence Savage, however, told council that "what

we are really doing here is the chicken and the egg," adding that city staff will present the other 12-13 suggested grant projects at the Feb. 13 hearing. Although the proposed Tarabusi Gardens project came in as the third highest priority, Call said it was pushed to

the top because "it would have the most impact because it would benefit the most people." The other suggested projects, Call said, could be paid for through other methods.

"It's an area in which we would probably not get funding from Community Development Block Grant otherwise," Savage said.

Unlike past years, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, which distributes the grant money, this year has allowed cities to include not only the lowest income areas but the second lowest as well.

"That opened up some areas in the city," Call added.

But the problem, he said, is that next year HUD officials may change their minds and restrict uses to the very lowest income areas again. That would put Tarabusi Gardens out of the running.

"In my book, there is no other area in this city that is more deserving," said Councilman Joe Alkateeb. Nonetheless, other council members qualified their approval.

"We're not committing to anything. We are just saying we'll look favorably on it," Dudley said.

cities during the last six months, emphasized that the group wouldn't support or criticize the president, whose photo is on some of the literature, or other candidates. "Personally, I'll vote for him (Reagan) and I hope he wins by a landslide," Lehrman said. "But Citizens for America will not tie itself to Ronald Reagan or any other candidate."

And both Lehrman and Headlee de-

nied that the group is a vehicle for their own political ambitions.

AS A NON-PARTISAN organization, Citizens for America is supported by some "prominent Democrats," Lehrman said, naming former Massachusetts governor Edward King and former Boston mayor John Collins.

"We expect to extend our reach as far as we can," said Lehrman. Admittedly John Szetst, a Lehrman aide, "We don't have Democrats knocking down our doors, but I think a lot of

prominent Democrats who would like to support us are running for re-election.

"These are the realities of politics. They (the potential Democratic supporters) would be torn apart if they came out for us."

Concerning his unsuccessful campaign for governor, Headlee disagreed with a stated opinion that he was unpopular with women voters because of his attacks on feminists.

"We did as well with women as any Republican politician has," he said.

"But there was 17-percent unemployment at the time — the highest in history. There was a Republican president and a Republican governor in August of 1982. The average American blamed them."

The press conference was followed by a luncheon in the Alexander Hamilton dining room during which Lehrman urged the mostly Republican gathering "to bring the Reagan revolution to a successful conclusion" with their financial support and time.

ed a feasibility study for a proposed police facility located at the building showing that the building should be located adjacent to

Paid for with \$30,000 from the Economic Development Corp., the study

will include plans and a timetable for the widening of the thoroughfare, and preliminary ideas for a new interchange onto I-696.
