

Historian will speak to DAR winners

Mrs. Orvis L. Henke, regent of Quakertown Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution, will welcome the winners of the DAR American History Essay Contest and their parents and teachers at 1 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 21, in Farmington Hills Branch Library.

Guests of honor for the afternoon are Bill Ogden, his parents John and Katie Ogden, and his teacher Elaine Palmer from Wooddale Elementary School; Brian Dyrda, his parents Charles and Kathy Dyrda, and his teacher Richard Stasser from Wooddale; Paula Artman and her parents Frank and Bonnie Artman from Fairlane Christian School; Melissa Riggs, her parents Donald and Barbara Riggs and her teacher Rebecca Griffith of Fairlane Christian; and Leslie Pacheco, her parents Fred and Cynthia Pacheco and her teacher Ellen

Mrs. C. Harold Dolph, American History Month chairman for Quakertown, will give each student a certificate and a bronze medal for excellence in American history.

FINNEY'S presentation will be based on the history of Company F, Seventh Michigan Volunteer Infantry during the Civil War. Company F was from Farmington, and in honor of Michigan's Civil War governor Austin Blair, the men were known as the Blair Guards.

The regiment served with distinction, valor and gallantry during the important battles of Fredericksburg, Gettysburg and Cold Harbor.

Finney's talk will include anecdotes and reminiscences based on memoirs of Civil War soldiers.

Finney is a graduate of Indiana University where he received both his bachelor's and master's degrees. He also received the Education Specialist degree from Wayne State University where he pursued advanced studies in curriculum development. In addition, he is a veteran of the U.S. Army.

He is a member of Phi Kappa Tau, Phi Delta Kappa, the Farmington Education Association, the Company of Military Historians and the Regimental Civil War Round Table.

In 1983 he was a member of the executive committee of Michigan at Perryville Society which erected a Civil War monument to honor Michigan soldiers that fought in the battle of Perryville, Ky. He was appointed to serve as a member of Farmington Historical Commission.

FINNEY HAS worked as a seasonal historian for the National Park Service in Petersburg, Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Battlefields in Virginia. He has lectured on Civil War topics and spoken to organizations throughout the United States.

He has published several articles on the Civil War, and as a collector of Civil War photographs he has had copies of his pictures published in both "Civil War Times Illustrated" and "Images of War 1861-1865."
