Three residents from Farmington Hills are among 25 selected to serve on the Twelve Oaks Fashion Panel through 1984.

The Fashion Panel was selected from nearly 200 applicants, ages 16 to

22. An evaluation was made from personal interviews and runway presentations by a panel of fashion and retail experts. Applicants were judged on gracefulness, projection of personality, enthusiasm, style and self-confidence.

Polish studies available

Applications are being accepted for summer studies in Poland through the Wayne State University Polish Studies Program.

Students will study for six weeks at the Polonia Research Institute of the Jagiellonian University in Krakow.

The course will include 60 hours of

language classes and lectures on Polish history and culture. Students will also tour Warsaw, Czestochowa, Zakopane, Wieliczka and the Auschwitz death camp.

Tentative dates of July 15 through Aug. 25 include one week of touring. Costs for tuition, room and board in a dormitory and travel costs while in Po-

land are included in a fee of \$450. International air fares must be paid by the student.

A maximum of 12 WSU students may receive tuition assistance for the course. While the program is not limited to Wayne State students, only Wayne students will be considered for financial assistance.

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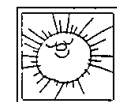
