Y offers special swim program for arthritics

The National YMCA and the National Arthritis Foundation have joined together to establish a recreational water program for people with arthritis.

Swimming ability is not necessary for participation. This class does not replace a prescribed regimen of therapeutic exercises, but studies have shown that the resistance property of water can help decrease pain or stiffness and improve or maintain joint flexibility, increase muscle strength and improve coordination.

The Arthritis Aquatic Program is being conducted in cooperation with the Arthritis Foundation. It is a recreational series of gentle activities in the

pool and is open to anyone with arthritis. The sessions will be conducted by trained personnel.

A special registration form is required and a participant's doctor will be sent a physician's consent form by the YMCA. A registration form may be obtained from the physical education secretary or Lyn Ruttenberg, aquatic instructor, at the Livonia YMCA.

The class begins Tuesday, March 6, and will continue each Tuesday for seven weeks between 10:15 and 10:45 a.m. at the Livonia YMCA, 14255 Stark Road, Livonia.

Fee for "Y" members is \$10 and \$16 for non-members for the seven-week course.
