# Walled Lake nips program for the poor

Walled Lake School District's Head Start program, for preschool children in low income families, will be termi-nated in June, the school board decided

"Federal funding for Head Start has not increased, but program costs have," said Hugh Davies, director of elementary education.

Head Start is a 24-hour program four days a week for prekindergarten children. Program eligibility is determined solely on the basis of family income.

A morning and an afternoon pro-gram take place at Decker Elementary School, each serving 15 studenta. Dub-lin Elementary School holds a morning class, which also serves 15 youngsters. Davies noted that 120 children were eligible for the program this year.

AT LAST WEEK'S meeting, Davies asked the board for \$5,000 in general-fund dollars to support the program for the balance of the school year. Davies noted the budget abortfall
was due to a decrease in 1984 federal
funding. In June, the Oakland Livingaton Human Service Agency (DLIESA)
informed the district it would receive
\$41,240 in federal funding. and \$13,146
in non-federal funding. This allocation
left the program with a projected deficit of \$3,000. SAMI ALAM, director of planning and evaluation, informed OLHSA the district could not absorb the shortfall, but the agency refused to relimburse the program for the difference between projected cost and its allocation of federal dollars. In addition, OLHSA officials earlier this month said they could not allocate an additional \$1,000 to cover a shortfall in the budgeted amount for teacher salaries.

Complicating the issue, Davies said, is the district's non-compliance with regulations from state Department of Social Services, requiring adult monitors on school buses carrying 4-year-old children.

Davies said the district tried to save money, by having a particularities.
