Trips to Israel and Las Vegas are among the many items up for bid when the Young Women of the Jewish National Fund presents its 13th annual auction, Sunday, April 1, at Temple Beth El, 7400 Telegraph, Birmingham.

A preview and silent auction will begin at 6:30 p.m. and the vocal auction starts at 8 p.m. Richard Nuzalin, auctioneer of Norman Levy Associates Inc., will conduct the bidding and sales.

Refreshments will be served. Tickets are \$3.50 and are available at the door or by calling the JNF office at 557-6644, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through

Thursday, and 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Friday.

As the sole land-development agency in Israel, JNF is responsible for preparing settlements, building roads, planting forests and turning sand into land.

Other items to be auctioned include hotel overnights, a \$1,000 Defenders Video Arcade Game, a \$100 gift certificate to Saks, Hudson's teen driver education courses and artwork by noted local artists.

Proceeds from this auction will go toward paying for a security road in Israel. High on the list of priorities is

Jewish resettlement of the Galilee is the construction of vital roads connecting outposts to the larger centers, providing access for necessary daily patrols by security forces.

The security road on the Lebanese border is 2.5 kilometers long, extending between Even Menachem and Shetulah. The project cost is \$75,000 and funding should be completed this year.
