Theological Education Week observed by church

Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Church of Farmington Hills will celebrate Theological Education Week through March 31 announced the Rev. S.J. Anthony, parish priest of Holy Cross Church.

The Archdiocese of the Greek Orthodox Church has designated the week to draw attention to the importance of practicing faith in daily life, to encourage theological education on the parish level and to draw attention to the efforts of Hellenic College and Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology in Brookline, Mass.

Hellenic College and Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology are institutions of higher learning offering undergraduate and graduate education. Founded as Holy Cross Theological Seminary in 1918, in Pomfret, Conn., the school serves as one seminary of the Greek Orthodox Church in the Americas. In 1947 the institution moved to Brookline and in 1963 was expanded to include a four-year liberal arts undergraduate college, known as Hellenic College. Today, Holy Cross school of Theology serves as the graduate school of the institution.

In 1982 Hellenic College and Holy Cross received a 10-year reaccreditation from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges and the Association of Theological Schools in the U.S. and Canada. The undergraduate college offers the degree of Bachelor of Arts in communication arts, education and community services, management and pretheology. Holy Cross offers graduate programs of study leading to

the degrees of Master of Divinity, Master of Theological Studies and Master of Arts in Church Service.

"Hellenic College and Holy Cross strive to meet the efforts of the Greek Orthodox Church in the Americas to educate priests and laypersons who in their chosen professions will embody the values and spirit of Orthodox Christianity," said Anthony, who is also vice president of the alumni association of Hellenic College.
