FUNERAL COST PRE-PAYMENT

If you wish, you may choose not to do anything at all about pre-paying your funeral expenses. Let the money come out of your estate's assets when you die. It's obvious that there will be money in your estate — in the form of savings, insurance, cashable stocks or bonds, or other liquid assets — that probably all the protection you survive needs. The money you would otherwise tie up for funeral payments could be invested or put into savings instead.

The disadvantage of this course is that your estate may never be so large as to cover the funeral costs adequately. Another possibility is that even if you are well off now, your financial fortunes may change to such a degree that there won't be much money in the estate when you die. In such cases, your survivors would be under great financial strain to meet the cost of your funeral and burial. It may require going into insurance money or other resources more urgently needed to live on.




