Mercy inaugurates new president

Maureen A. Fay will be inaugurated president of Mercy College of Detroit at 3 p.m. Friday, March 30.
Thomas V. Angott, chairman of Mercy's Board of Trustees, will install Sister Fay as the college's fifth president at the convocation to be held in Mercy's McAuley Auditorium.

From 1964-71, Sister Fay held consecutive faculty positions at St. Paul High School in Grosse Pointe and at Dominican High School in Detroit under the religious name of Sister Marie Timothy, and at Siena Heights College.
After leaving Michigan in 1971, Sister Fay served as an educational evaluator for the Institute for Criminal Justice Executives at the University of Chicago. She was an instructor in the University of Illinois English department until 1974.

Margaret Ann Parley, associate professor of Christian Ethics at Yale Divinity School, will be the guest speaker. The title of her address is "Push Back the Horizons: Educating for Freedom."

SHE LEFT that position to become director of evaluation for DePaul University's School for New Learning, a nontraditional competency-based degree program for adults. In 1975, she joined St. Xavier's staff.

Dr. Charles O'Connell, University of Chicago vice president and dean of students, will be master of ceremonies.
Sister Fay, a member of the Adrian Dominican order of sisters, is the first president in Mercy's history who is not a member of the Religious Sisters of Mercy, the order that founded the college 43 years ago.

Sister Fay has been a member of various professional organizations including the Consortium for Quality in Nontraditional Education at the University of Chicago, the Siena Heights College Board of Trustees and the American Association of Adult Education. She has written a number of published reviews, reports and papers.
Seven hundred guests are expected to attend the inauguration, including 50 delegates from regional colleges and universities and from professional societies and associations.

Sister Fay assumed responsibilities as Mercy's fifth president in August 1983. She was previously the Dean of Continuing Education and of Graduate Studies at Saint Xavier College in Chicago.

Mercy College of Detroit is an independent college that blends the liberal arts and professional programs. More than 2,200 students attend classes in 58 day, evening and weekend programs.

A native of Chicago, Sister Fay earned her bachelor's degree from Siena Heights College in Adrian, Mich., and her master's degree from the University of Detroit. She earned her doctorate in adult and higher education in 1976 from the University of Chicago, where she was a Carnegie Fellow.
