

# Theater features 'A Funny Thing Happened'

The Smith Performing Arts Theatre on the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College will present its first live musical comedy, Stephen Sondheim's "A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum" Friday.

The musical production will begin a five night, one matinee run of this fast-paced comedy.

The story concerns the conviving of a slave, Pseudos, to achieve his freedom. His young master, Hero, promises Pseudos to grant him freedom if he can obtain for Hero the beautiful girl Philia, whom he has seen from a window. Deliciously misanthropic characters, parents, neighbors and even strangers, are involved in the mounting confusion as this comedy unfolds.

STEPHEN SONDHEIM's musical numbers range from witty patter songs to ballads, and the score merrily underlines the comedy on the stage. The

great Latin master Plautus was the inspiration of the authors, the situations that kept the Romans laughing once again prove merry and delightful in this musical.

A 17-piece orchestra, under the direction of Paul A. Ferris, will enhance the singing and dancing of the 20 member cast. The cast includes actors and actresses who have worked with such diverse groups as: Michigan Lyric and Opera Company, Young People's Stage Theatre, Pacific Conservatory of Performing Arts, Michigan Opera Theatre, Pine Knob, Oakland University, The

Scandinavian Symphony and Michigan State University.

The choreographer is Joe Neal of the Harbinger Dance Company, and the vocal coaching has been done by lyric coloratura Carolyn Grimes.

Farmington Hills needs more election inspectors to work at the precincts during upcoming elections. City Clerk Floyd Cairns is taking applications for the positions, which pay \$3.75 a hour.

To be considered you must be a reg-

istered voter and declare your party.

Generally, the city hires approximately 140 election inspectors for state and federal elections, he said.

Applications should be in the city clerk's office before July 1.

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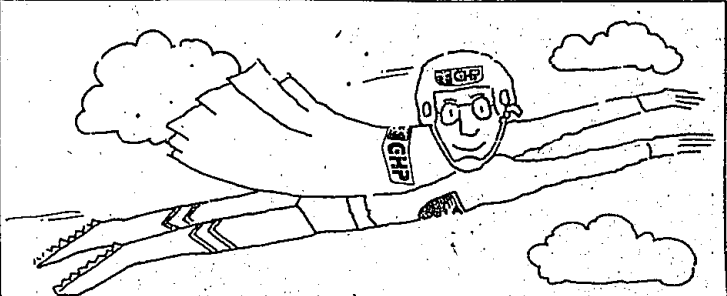
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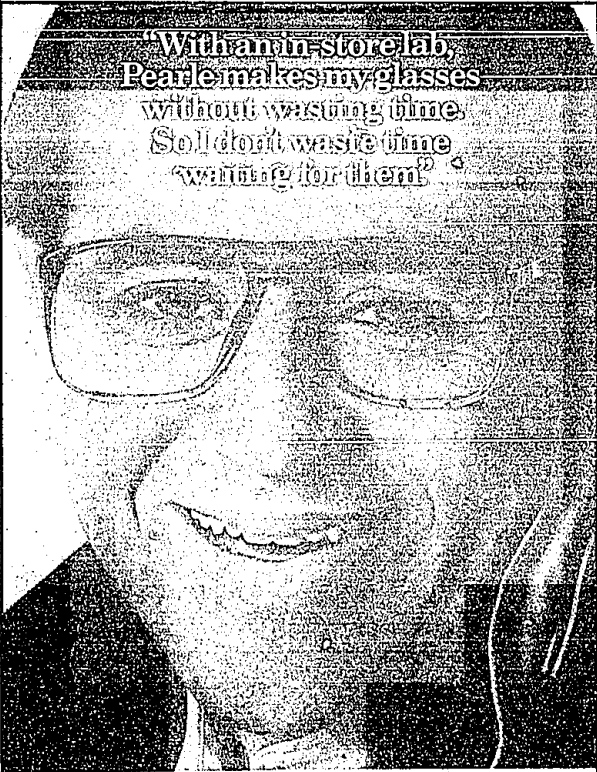
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
