
Sisterhood speaker Swan Lake ballet Prenatal, postnatal classes set is famed Nazi hunter performed

Submitted words are judged by panels of published authors and finalists continue to a last round of judging. The winners in each of seven categories will be announced June 30 at the RWA Awards Banquet to be held in conjunction with the fourth annual RWA conference in Detroit's Westin Hotel.
