

Sisterhood speaker Swan Lake ballet is famed Nazi hunter performed

Sandra Schwartz, vice president of fund raising in Congregation Shaarey Zedek Sisterhood is in charge of Women's World 1984. The all-day fund-raising event will take place Wednesday, May 2, in the Southfield Synagogue.

The day begins at 9 a.m. with continental breakfast and aisles of boutique shopping, followed by catered luncheon. Woman's World speaker is Beate Klarfeld, the Nazi hunter who has been most recently credited with tracking down the infamous Klaus Barbie, the "Butcher of Lyon."

Tickets for the day are \$25 sponsor, \$35, \$50 and \$1000 patron. Schwartz has been active in many capacities at the Sisterhood, including serving as corresponding secretary and financial secretary.

She has been an active member of the West Bloomfield-Farmington Area League of Women Voters for several years. She serves on the board of directors of the American Cancer Society, Central Oakland Unit, and on the Michigan Advisory Board of the Anti-Fascism League of B'nai B'rith.

Youth in concert April 15

Metropolitan Youth Symphony stages its Spring Pops Concert at 3 p.m. Sunday, April 15, in Southfield High School, corner of 10 Mile and Lahser Road.

Favorites on the bill are "The Entertainer," "I Sing the Body Electric" from Fame, "Edelweiss," and "Memory" from the musical "Cats."

The symphony will also perform se-

lections from "Annie," "Porgy and Bess" and "That's Entertainment."

Thomas V. Course conducts the high schoolers. Douglas Bianchi leads the concert orchestra made up of those in eighth grade and up; and Judith Culler takes the baton for the string orchestra composed of fifth graders and up. Tickets are \$3 at the door.

Oakway Symphony's final concert of its 1984 season will be Tchaikovsky's "Swan Lake," performed by Contemporary Civic Ballet at 3 p.m. Sunday, April 15, 11 Mile and Middlebelt Road.

The orchestra is under director and choreographer Rose Marie Floyd. One of the featured performers of the program will be James Dunne who was trained in the School of American Ballet, as well as Jeffrey Ballet. He has toured Europe and the U.S. in principal parts including the Spoleto Festival of "Two Worlds in Italy" and "New York Export Opus Jazz" with Jerome Robbins. He has also appeared in Broadway performances of "Dancin'" and "Can-Can," as well as in TV's "The Bob Hope Special" and "Baryshnikov in Hollywood."

Also featured will be Kathryn Cooke, a student of Floyd who received a ballet degree from Indiana University. She appeared at Indiana University dancing the "Sleeping Beauty" grande pas de deux, and recently danced abroad with the Scottish-American Ballet.

Floyd will receive the "Dance Teacher of the Year Award" from the Michigan Dance Association.

The program will include, in addition to "Swan Lake," Gounod's "Faust Ballet Music," and "Ronde Capriccioso."

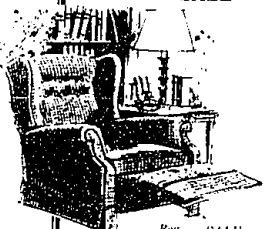
The orchestra, under the baton of director and conductor Francesco Di Biasi, will also work with guest conductor Ernest Jones.

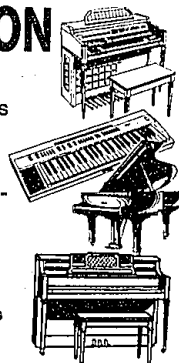

Romance writers name finalists

Marianne Willman of Farmington Hills, Ruth Langan of Southfield, and Jocelyn Griffin of Ann Arbor, have been named finalists in the annual Romance Writers of America (RWA) Golden Medallion Awards competition for published writers. All are members of the Greater Detroit Chapter of RWA.

"Apache Tears," published by Rapture Romance, put her in the Sensual Category of the competition.

Langan and Griffin are both in the Traditional Category of the competition. Langan is author of "Hidden Love" published by Silhouette Romance. Griffin is author of "The White Wave" published by Harlequin Romance.

The Golden Medallion is the acknowledgment of excellence from RWA, the nation's largest organized writers' group, and is the romance genre's equivalent to Hollywood's Oscar or Broadway's Tony awards.

Submitted words are judged by panels of published authors and finalists continue to a last round of judging. The winners in each of seven categories will be announced June 30 at the RWA Awards Banquet to be held in conjunction with the fourth annual RWA conference in Detroit's Westin Hotel.

WILLMAN AND Langan are founders of the Greater Detroit Chapter of the organization. Willman is now president of the chapter and Langan its treasurer. All three Golden Medallion contenders are active in RWA activities and all three will be speakers during the spring conference.

In addition to workshops featuring editors and authors from major romance publishing houses, the conference will offer editor-author and agent-author appointments. Guests at the conference will be able to meet one-on-one with an editor or agent for 15 minute periods.

Nationwide, membership in the organization is 2,000. The national conference coordinator is expecting about 700 persons for the conference this year.

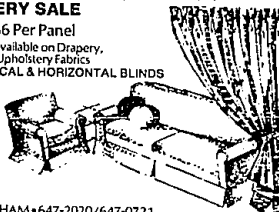
