

Albion students celebrate Seder

The Albion College Jewish Fellowship is sponsoring a celebration of the April 18 Passover Seder which com-

memorates the deliverance of the Jewish people from Egyptian bondage.

The Seder, is a ritual feast symbolizing the Jewish exodus from Egypt will be at 4:30 p.m. in the Mary Sykes Room in Baldwin Hall.

Prior to the meal, members of the Jewish Fellowship, Lisa Adelman, Bloomfield Hills senior, Margaret Falk, Farmington Hills senior and Eileen Smith, Ann Arbor sophomore, will lead the participants through the story of the Jewish people's escape from Egypt.

The Seder service will be performed in both Hebrew and English by these three members. The story is taken from the Haggadah, which will be supplied for all attending the Seder.

A Seder plate contains five items which celebrate all the things done by the Jewish people when they escaped from Egypt. The plate includes: charoses, a mixture of apples, nuts, cinnamon and wine symbolizing the mortar used between bricks they laid as slaves; bitter herb, which is parsley and salt water representing the pain and suffering (parsley) and tears (salt water) of the journey; roasted shankbone of lamb, a hard-boiled egg and Karpas, which is celery or lettuce.

The most widely known food of the Jewish Passover is matzo, unleavened bread. Matzo also has a history in the exodus from Egypt, Smith said. "The slaves only had flour and water. This

baked in the sun, and matzo came about," she said.

Smith said the Seder meal "is something (done) to educate the campus. There is really a lack of knowledge of anything about Judaism."

The Seder meal itself will include chicken soup with matzo balls, turkey, broccoli, kugel (noodles and matzo meal) and honey cake, made with special flour.

Tax deadline is Monday

Farmington Postmaster Kenneth B. Harris advises against delay, but if mail until the April 16 deadline to mail your income tax returns, you have until midnight to deposit them at the main post office if it is to bear the "Tax Monday" postmark.

The mailing deadline for returns falls on Monday, April 16, this year because the usual cutoff date, April 15, is on Sunday.

Returns also may be placed in collection boxes in front of either the Farmington Post Office on Stearns or the Farmington Hills Post Office on 12 Mile Road up to midnight when they will be picked up for the April 16 postmark.

If you mail earlier in the day at a street collection box, check the collection schedule to be sure the next pickup will meet the deadline.

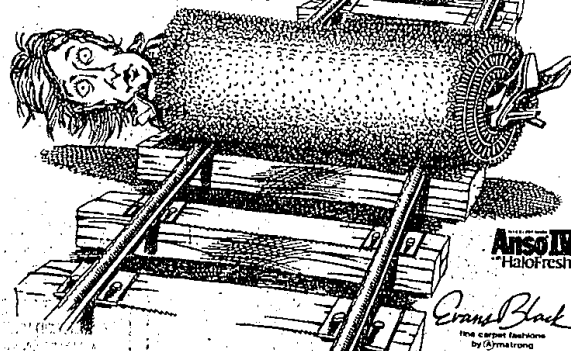
