Grandpersons called by SAGE

Spring session for Farmington's SAGE (Senior Adults Giving to Education) program will begin next month. Older adults are needed to spend their time with elementary youngsters one day a week for 45-60 minutes in a classroom.

The program will continue in Lakeshire and Longacre Elementary Schools and also begin in Eagle School for the first time. Transportation will be provided any older adult who requires it.

SAGE is Farmington's adaptation of the intergenerational concept whereby senior women and men meet in a

school setting to share their years of wisdom, experience and talents with children.

SAGE ACTS as a bridge between the generations for young and old learn about and enjoy each other. Seniors accomplish this by telling stories of olden days, relating their travels, teaching crafts.

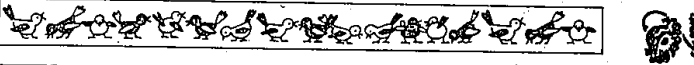
Among those who participated in the recent winter SAGE session was a gentleman who discussed history with fifth graders and an 88-year-old lady who began a creative writing course for youngsters.

11. Check starting capacitor contacts.
12. Check all wiring and connections.
13. Check air temperature across condenser.
14. Check that condenser drain is open.
