Secretaries picket board meeting

Charging the Walled Lake school board with lack of support and sluggish action on their 1983-84 contract, many of the district's 58 secretaries carried picket signs outside Walled Lake Junior High before last week's board meeting.

Following the board's rejection last month, the Walled Lake School Secretaries Association (WLSA) charged the board with unfair labor practice. A lawsuit was filed with the Michigan Employment Relations Commission (MERC) early in March.

KAREN FILAR, negotiator for the WLSA, said the suit charges the school board with assigning a negotiator who apparently did not carry the full authority of the board. The lawsuit was triggered last month when the board called in its chief negotiator, Rita Thomas of the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB), to assist in the secretarial contract talks. An assistant to Thomas was negotiating the secretaries' contract up until that time.

The board rejected the agreement Thomas' assistant had negotiated, and sent Filar a list of about 10 reasons why the document was rejected. "Secretaries negotiated with MASB and administrative representatives who we thought were discussing each article with the board as the work was completed," Mizzi said. Consequently, the union was surprised when the document was rejected with a list of shortcomings, she said.
