# Radio attenna issue discussed

Amateur radio operators will have one more opportunity in the latest round of debate to convince Farming-ton Hills officials to change the city's height restrictions for antenna towers at a public hearing schoduled for 7:30 p.m. feedght. Supporters and opponents of the pro-posed antenna height change will share a portion of toolght's meeting with resi-

dents opposing a proposed zone change at Franklin Fairway and 13 Mile near Northwestern Highway. Ham radio operators will be asking the council to overturn the planning commission's recommended denial of a request to add antenna towers to the zoning ordinance's list of height excep-tions.




