Camp open to asthmatic kids

Hiking, fishing, swimming, archery and other activities used to be available only to healthy children at "regular" summer camps. Kids with severe asthma were forced to sit around at home and miss out on the things they make a child's summer so special. Five years ago, however, Camp Sun Deer, America's only free summer camp for kids with asthma, opened so that asthmatic kids would have an opportunity to take part in the fun of summer camp.

Camp Sun Deer '84 is open again for Michigan kids ages 9 to 12 who have severe asthma. Sponsored by the American Lung Association of Southeastern Michigan (ALASEM) and co-sponsored by the Michigan Society for Respiratory Therapy (MSRT) and Michigan Pulmonary Lab, Inc., Camp Sun Deer is located 10 miles north of Battle Creek in Dowling, and is held July 1-7. ALASEM will be accepting applications for camp through Monday, May 14.

"Camp Sun Deer is different from other camps because everything is done with the asthmatic child in mind," says Carol Cohen, program coordinator of child lung health for ALASEM. "All the activities are designed in such a way that everyone is able to participate."

IN ADDITION, Camp Sun Deer offers a trained medical staff, available around the clock to handle special complications resulting from vigorous exercise or exposure to a variety of allergens.

The all-volunteer counseling staff includes physicians, nurses, physical therapists, recreational therapists, physical therapists and a large number of respiratory therapists who are members of MSRT.

The setting up of the special summer camp requires months of planning and preparation, but there is a reward in the end. "All the hard work we put into camp is worth it when we see the smiles on the kids' faces," states Cohen.
