## Northwest is selected as fund-raising target

Lutheran High School Northwest, Farmington Hills, has been selected as one of 86 Lutheran high schools across the nation to participate in LIFT, Lutheran Brotherhood's newest program

in support of Lutheran secondary education.

Lutheran Brotherhood is a national fraternal benefit society serving Lutherans nationwide.

Designed to aid Lutheran high schools, the purpose of the new program is to encourage increased giving to Lutheran high schools and to stimulate interest in endowment support for long-term needs. The program is scheduled to run for five years from July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1989.

Beginning July 1, Lutheran Brotherhood will match gifts from \$25-\$100 contributed by eligible members of the fraternal benefit society to the school.

Members are eligible if they have a Lutheran Brotherhood life, health or annuity contract in force, or own shares, individually or jointly, in a Lutheran Brotherhood mutual fund.

During the first year, all gifts and L.B.'s matching grant will be unrestricted as to use.

During the second to fourth years, an

increasing percentage of the LIFT receipts and L.B.'s matching grants will be placed in the school's permanent endowment.

During the fifth year, all receipts including L.B.'s matching grant will be placed in the school's endowment.

Lutheran Brotherhood contributed nearly \$5 million in support of Lutheran education in 1983. The LIFT program for Lutheran high school education is one of many fraternal programs administered by the Society.
