Although falling in these grand attempts Pippin learns to savour the simple joys of life.

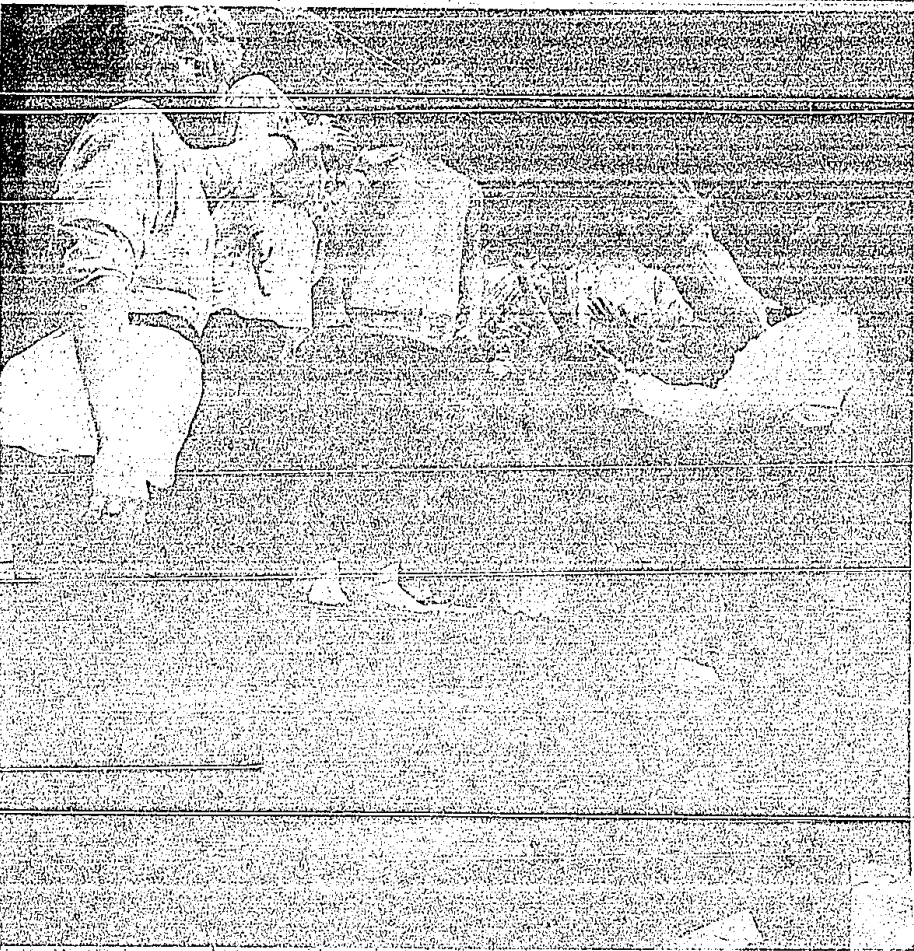

Reserved tickets are \$4. Tickets also may be purchased at the door. For more information, call 620-2511.

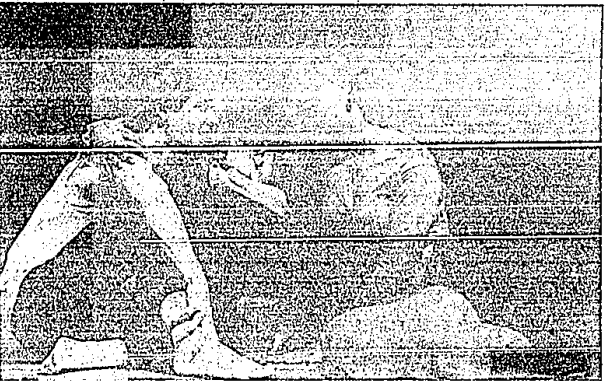


Autumn Dunbar and Mark Moore get together for a "Pippin" rehearsal at North Farmington High School.
