

## Friends give another gift to library

During the past year, the Farmington Friends of the Library donated computer terminals to access online databases. This month, as David Bolla, long-time president of the Friends left that office, another gift was made to cover a portion of the costs of a new security system as well as improve the book collection.

"The gifts have significantly helped to improve library services," library director Gordon Lewis said.

"The computerized reference service connects to databases in California, New York and Minneapolis. These da-

tases are being utilized by the corporations and professional groups in the community as well as individuals," he said.

There are more than 400 databases now available on a wide range of subjects. The security system provided by the Friends, with additional money from the cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills, will help reduce theft of materials from the library, he said.

## Health professionals invited to workshop

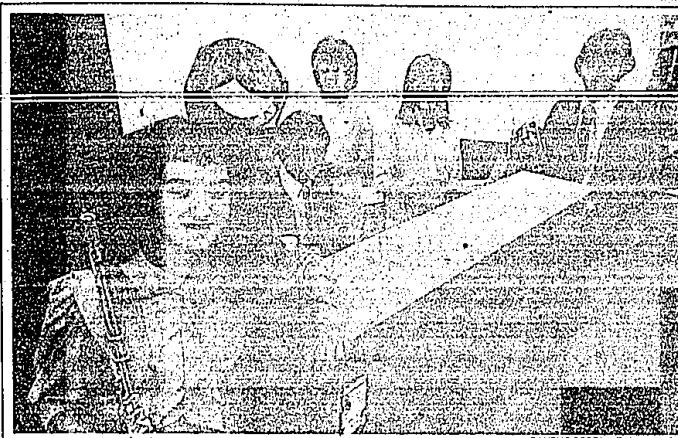
Problems unique to women working in the health professions will be topics for discussion at a two-weekend workshop in Madonna College, Livonia, beginning May 18.
