

Mercy kickers rip Foley; playoffs next

Mary Duwel couldn't have picked a better time to break into the scoring column.

The sophomore right-wing broke loose for three goals — her first three in Catholic League play — to propel the Marlins to a 6-2 girls soccer triumph at Madison Heights Bishop Foley Thursday, assuring them a spot in the league playoffs.

The win pushed Mercy's record to 5-1 in the league. The team's last conference game was scheduled to be Tuesday against Detroit Dominican, but Dominican dropped the sport.

That means Mercy will finish 6-1, second behind Birmingham Marian. The top four league finishers qualify for the playoffs.

The Marlins blended sophomore Duwel's scoring efforts with that of a senior ace Annette Ruggiero, who netted two goals to push her league-leading total to 13 in six games. Margaret DeMatteis also had a score for Mercy.

On Tuesday, Ruggiero banged in four goals and Amy DeMatteis added another as Mercy routed Redford Bishop Borgess, 5-1.

N. FARMINGTON 6, FRANKLIN 0: Kristi McMinn's three goals sparked North Farmington to

an easy victory over Livonia Franklin Wednesday at North.

The Raiders dominated throughout, firing 47 shots at the Franklin goal while allowing just four. Jean Anzovaro added two goals and Sandy Spahn one as North grabbed a 3-0 halftime advantage.

The Raiders are 3-7-1.

HARRISON 2, LATHRUP 0: Farmington Harrison earned its first win of the season behind Kim Larson's shutout goalkeeping and Michelle Wise's two goals Friday at Harrison.

Wise scored twice in the first half and the Hawks (1-10-1 for the season) choked off all Southfield-Lathrup's scoring chances thereafter. Jeanine Whittemore and Alisa Kay provided solid defense for Harrison.

STEVENSON 10, FARMINGTON 0: The Falcons simply were no match for defending state champion Livonia Stevenson Friday.

Mary Kay Hussey and Leasa Kilz each scored three goals for Stevenson (12-1). Hussey has 30 goals for the season.

On Wednesday, Farmington bested crosstown rival Harrison 4-1.

Vee racer reigns

Andres Serrano is on a roll.

The Farmington Hills Formula Vee racer won the Sports Car Club of America's (SCCA) National race at Mid-American Raceway near St. Louis last Monday.

The win, coupled with a second-place finish at the season opener race April 23, puts Serrano in first place in the SCCA Central Division standings and in a position for a berth in the Road Atlanta National in Gainesville, GA.

Serrano captured the pole position with a qualifying time of 2:20.8 on the 2.86-mile, 12-turn circuit,

but dropped back to the fourth spot at the beginning of the race. He fell back as far as sixth, but he raced to the head of the pack after the ninth lap.

DOWN THE stretch, it was a five-car race. Serrano took command in the final two laps, beating second-place finisher Michael Gray of Kansas City by .6 seconds.

Serrano's average speed was 77.28 mph. His time was 2:09.9, the second-fastest time in the race's history.

Marlins roll to first dual win

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy won its first track dual meet of the season, and the Marlins did it in merciful fashion, routing Birmingham Marian 104-23 Tuesday at Farmington Harrison.

Tori Ford won three events and Aimee DePotter captured a pair as the Marlins finished first in every event but one. Ford's wins came in the long jump (14-2) and the 100-meter (14.0) and 200-meter (28.6) dashes. DePotter was triumphant in the shot put (28-5) and discus (91-9).

Other Mercy winners were Tracey Balog in the 110 hurdles (18.3), Shannon Percy in the 300 hurdles (56.5), Colleen Flynn in the 400 (1:07.0), Laurie Huston in the 800 (2:39.8), Ellen McCarthy in the 1,600 (5:46.7), Chris Strand in the 3,200 (13:28.7), and the 400 (54.0), 800 (1:59.9), 1,600 (4:33.2) and 3,200 (11:18.0) relays.
