The famous cave paintings in south-em France may have been man's first attempt at wallcovering.

In the middle of the 18th century, the first wallpaper was mass produced in a factory in France that employed hundreds of people.

The introduction of the roller printing

machine in 1830 led to the unprecedent-ed popularity of wallpapers that contin-ued until the early part of this century. In the 1940s, silk-screen printing of-fered exceptional quality and color in wallpaper. Scrubbable, pretrimmed, pre-parted wallengerings came an the scene pasted wallcoverings came on the scene in the '50s, followed by durable synthetics and strippable wallcoverings.

Now, with the resurgence in the popularity of wallcoverings, many new designs, patterns and materials are conceived in designer studios before they are mass produced.

Today's wallcoverings can be bought at paint and wallpaper stores, home centers and department stores.


