The Academy of the Sacred Heart was founded in a rented home on Valence and August in Petroit June 2 Jefferson Avenue in Detroit June 2,

The first school opened with an en-rollment of 10 day pupils and three or-phans. The building still stands facing the Renaissance Center. Between 1851 and 1861 the academy occupied incelling locations on Jefferson Avenue. The school soon outgrew its quarters and in 1851 ground was broken for a larger building at 332 E. Jefferson Ave, between S. Antoine and Beaublen streets. The academy-stayed 57 years at this location.

Place in a brown grocery beg. Store in a dry, dark area on a ment floor or a substitute. Darkness is the secret. Forget about them. Every once in a while, peck in the bag to see if they are gathering moisture. No good.

IN THE fall, at bulb planting time, take them out of the bag, remove the dried up leaves and replant in the garden. I have seen this work successfully




