The Citizens' Advisory Committee will include such agencies as the YMCA, Community Center, Oakland Commonity College, public and private schools and community Cuber.

Farmington Hills City Council mem-bers voted Tuesday night to accept "re-gretfully" the resignation of City Man-ager Larry Savage effective June 30.

In his resignation letter, Savage said to had been considering his retirement and consequent resignation for the past several months.

"I feel I have met this commitment having completed my fifth year in February of this year."
"Tm sure this comes as a surprise to many of you (the audience) out there," acting Mayor Jan Dolan said.

Dolan expressed her regrets at losing Savage who, she said, has been "a super guy to work with, and who has given us an extra six months of his time."

Council members Jodi Soronen, Joe Alkateeb and Donn Wolf also expressed regrets about Savage's resignation.
"It is with deep regret that we see him (Savage) leave," Soronen said.

SAVAGE SAID he feels the time is "appropriate" for him to retire and that "now is a proper time" for his res-

that "now is a proper time" for his res-ignation.

"A good staff is, in place and a most competent and able essistant city man-ager has been with the organization for several years," Savage sald in his res-ignation letter.

"The current fiscal year is closing and the budgets for the coming year have been prepared and submitted to Council for its consideration," Savage added.

Costick comes "highly recommend-ed" for the position, and Dolan. "Larry (Savage) has been grooming him sil along for the position," Dolan


The board also granted Savage three months compensation pay as part of his severance pay.

Savage was selected from a field of 4 candidates and appointed by the card in 1978 to fill the spot vacated y George Majoros in August 1978.

Savage's contract expires Jane 30, 1984 and was last renewed July 1, 1983.

Before coming to Farmington Hills, Savago served as chief administrative executive for 15 years in Traverso City where he administered a 910 million annual budget and 220 employees. Savago plans to spend his retirement time back in Traverso City.
