Joel D. Gershenson of Birmingham, chairman, and Geraid Rogers of Southfield, associate chairman of the Detroit

chairman, and Gerald Rogers of South-field, associate chairman of the Detroit Soviet Jewry Committee of the Jewish Community Council (BSJC), report that more than 5,000 postcards addressed to Jubier Perez de Cuellar, Secretary General of the United Nations, have been distributed locally.

During the Odessa raids, KGB agents forced their way into homes to search for weapons. Once Inside, the actual search involved religious items, books, seder plates, candiesticks, haggadot. Any symbol of connection to the Jewish people was destroyed or confiscated.

Postcards being sent as part of the campaign read, "Dear Mr. Secretary General, I have just learned that the KGB broke into the homes of 10 Odessa Jowa to search for weapons. They didn't find any, instead they destroyed everything they could find that was in any way Jewish, including the menuzoi control of the Committee of the United Nations, including the menuzoi control of the United Nations, home of the U.N. Declaration on Human Rights, I appeal to you to call Soviet Ambassador Oleg Troyanovsky lato your office. Demand to know why such a flagrant, victous anti-Semille action took place.
