CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. on May 31, 1984, by Mayor Yoder in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESENT: Bennett, Walker, Yoder.

OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Dilling, Director Selfert, City Attorney Kelly, City Clerk Bushey.

Minutes of previous meeting were approved.

Council held a Public Hearing on increasing property taxes and to review the 1984-85 proposed fiscal year budget.

The Beautification Council of Southeastern Michigan Award was presented to the Mayor and City Council by Carol Kurth, Farmington Beautification Committee.

Minutes of other Boards were received and/or filed.

Council received the City of Birmingham resolution concerning penalties for improper use of drivers' licenses.

Council renewed the rubbish removal contract with McCreedy Trucking.

Council accepted the low bid of Sullivan-Wagner Roofing, \$3,698.00, for reroofing four DPW buildings.

Council authorized partial payment of \$13,264.93 to DiNello Construction Company for work completed on the Combined Sewer Overflow River Cross-Connection project.

Council tabled the proposed amendment on the Sidewalk Policy until the next regular meeting.

Council received the Board of Review Report for the 1984 Tax Appeals.

Council adopted a resolution certifying delinquent special assessment payments, water bills and service invoices.

ORDINANCE NO. C-516-84

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON BY ADDING A NEW SECTION, WHICH NEW SECTION SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS SECTION 8.4 OF CHAPTER 78 OF TITLE VII OF SAID CODE

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

Pursuant to the laws of the State of Michigan, the City of Farmington authority for issuing Electrical Licensing is hereby transferred to the State of Michigan. An Electrical License issued by the City of Farmington and currently in effect shall remain in effect until December 31, 1984, provided that the license complies with applicable laws and ordinances.

This ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the Farmington City Council on May 7, 1984, was adopted and enacted at the next regular meeting on May 21, 1984, and will become effective ten days after publication.

Jews protest KGB raids

An international postcard campaign is under way protesting to the United Nations about the Soviet secret police

(KGB) raids on the homes of 10 Jewish families in Odessa.

Joel D. Gershenon of Birmingham, chairman, and Gerald Rogers of Southfield, associate chairman of the Detroit Soviet Jewry Council (DSJC), report that more than 5,000 postcards addressed to Javier Perez de Cuellar, Secretary General of the United Nations, have been distributed locally.

During the Odessa raids, KGB agents forced their way into homes to search for weapons. Once inside, the actual search involved religious items, books, seder plates, candles, hagaddah.

Any symbol of connection to the Jewish people was destroyed or confiscated. Postcards being sent as part of the campaign read, "Dear Mr. Secretary General, I have just learned that the KGB broke into the homes of 10 Odessa Jews to search for weapons. They didn't find any. Instead they destroyed everything they could find that was in any way Jewish, including the mezuzot on the doorposts."

"As the Secretary General of the United Nations, home of the U.N. Declaration on Human Rights, I appeal to you to call Soviet Ambassador Oleg Troyanovsky into your office. Demand to know why such a flagrant, vicious anti-Semitic action took place. Those of us in the free world will not stand by and let these events go unnoticed."
