

- Make sure you're thoroughly familiar with all features and controls on your camera, especially if it's new. Practice before you leave. Become an expert at changing film and lenses quickly and correctly.
- Travel light but don't leave an important piece of equipment home. In addition to your earners and normal lens, take along a wide angle and moderate telephoto (or xoom).
- A small flash unit and collapsible will be important. Take a polarizer filter for added impact in your scenic ahots.

- If going abroad, do some planning before you leave. Study the people, lo-cates, and customs. Have some ideas beforehand of what you may want to what or man.

- Most importantly, become involved in your travel photography. Immerse yourself in the places you visit. Try to bring home the essence of your vacation by always keeping your "traveler's vision" in high gear.
