"As you begin to develop your cable television script, let's prepare for 'Le Series' just in case you really enjoy this new venture and are on a roll."

Try to create your project with enough flexibility in your program to provide continuity from one program to another.

Pick your general topic. What are the necessary elements involved? How does this influence your life? What are some humorous or dramatic anecdotes to drive home your point?

For example, let's take my hobby of wind surfing as a general topic. The necessary elements involved are: ability to swim, understanding sailing techniques, weather conditions, sail board, sail and additional gear variances, transportation needs and appropriate sailing locations.

Windsurfing influences my life by providing an outlet that creates a completely personal and private environment to get away from it all including a mental and physical challenge that ensures a thrill and exhilaration unsurpassed by much else.

Because I initially did not respect

the tremendous importance of understanding the environment of the lake conditions and how they are affected by weather, I have had several mental and physically draining mishaps including being stranded alone in a severe current of an isolated inlet, and I had to swim for hours to a more populated area.

On the numerous side, watching other boats swoop down about you when they see you really sailing alone and wanting to talk.

You can easily see how there are many visually exciting shows that would capture audience interest.

Let's "Ride the Waves" together and produce your shows to encourage "Le Series."

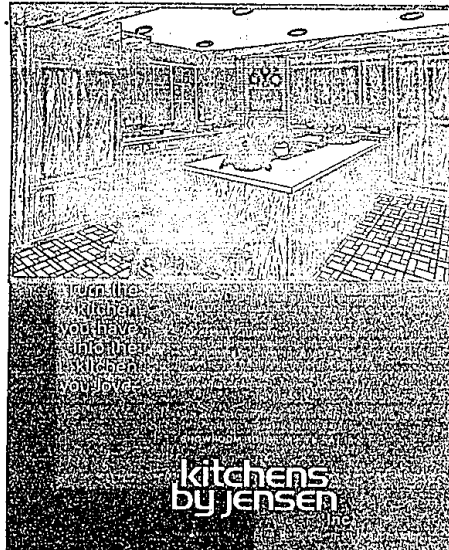

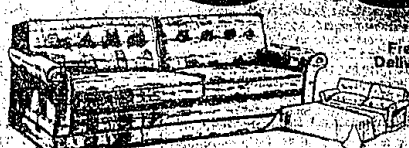
