After months of work by the committee for the ninth annual Babe Zaharias Golf Tournament, 283 area women are signed up to tee off Tuesday, June 11, at Pine Lake Country Club.

The Zaharias Invitational is the largest money making organization in the country for the American Cancer Society. The Michigan Division's inter-club tournament, one of the largest for women in the Detroit area, is one of the top fund-raisers nationwide.

This summer golfers from 22 area country clubs will participate in two shotgun starts at 8 a.m. and 2 p.m. Then low net winners will proceed to the Zaharias State Finals at Boyne Highlands.

"Over the last eight years we have raised \$350,000 and our goal this year is to top last year's \$77,400 raised at Tam O'Shanter," said Peggy Gemmell, speaking for the group.

Each year the tournament is played at the chairman's club. Jo Ann Sweezy is chairman for the event at Pine Lake. Next year's chairman is Candy Nelson, who has scheduled the play at Western Golf and Country Club.
