Road Rally Added To Festival Fun

A person might think that in automobile competition the hardest event is a 24-hour high speed race as held each year at LeMans, France. It isn't.

The roughest event probably is the East African Safari Rally, which involves many very slow stretches where the goal is to cover a distance in an amount of time set by the organizers rather than just being fastest.

NOW A RALLY for the Farmington area is planned, the first annual Farmington Founders Festival Rally.

The rally, planned to start at 1 p.m., Saturday, July 25, will be a limited entry rally with 50 to 60 cars competing.

It is being organized by several rally clubs in southeastern Michigan and will last between two and three hours.

The route followed by the rally will be through

Farmington, Farmington Township and parts of southern Oakland County.

CHECKPOINTS will be set up along the route by the rally clubs. The object is to go through the checkpoints in the exact amount of time set by the organizers.

Competitors will receive points depending on how far their times are off those set and the winner will be the driver with the fewest points.

The rally will start at the Town and Country Dodge used car lot, 31015 Grand River, and finish at Dunckel Junior High School on 12 Mile Rd., near Farmington Rd.

Trophies will be awarded to the winners.

The rally is being sponsored by the Farmington Founders Festival Committee and Rally Club of Michigan and Town and Country Dodge.

Kids Will Like

A Puppet Show will once again be staged during the Farmington Founders Festival by the Farmington Area Jaycee Auxiliary.

The shows will be held at the city hall, Liberty and Grand River, on Saturday at 11 a.m., 1 and 3 p.m. Each of the three presentations will last 45 minutes.

Admission will be 25 cents per child.

THE PUPPET SHOW is but one of the activities keeping auxiliary members busy during festival days, says President Susan Gernick.

"Since our first obligation is to the Jaycees, they have requested our services in making posters for the cars used in the parade."

"We will also be manning their food booth, selling pop and chips. At this booth, the auxiliary will also make and sell tacos."

BUT THE auxiliary will have its own activities during the festival.

An unusual project will be "Dab Art," which is a booth designed to let everyone be creative artists. Paints are squirted on a spinning disc-making the colors blend, smear, run and glob together. No two pictures are ever the same.

"Happiness Is" is the slogan picked to promote a mobile hearing unit open noon to 6 p.m. each day of the festival. The auxiliary is sponsoring this testing for hearing disabilities. Anyone five years or older will be tested free.

The auxiliary will also be taking orders for medical I.D. tags. The tags include name, address, city and a line to list any allergy a child might have. Samples will be available. Cost is \$1.

Fun At Carnival

The carnival will once again be staged for residents during all three days of the Farmington Founders Festival.

As in past years, the carnival will be held at the Demery's Shopping Center, 12 Mile and Farmington Rds., from noon until 10 p.m. each day.
