

Musicians will travel in exchange program

Three area musicians will be among the almost 1,000 talented young American and European teens who will be participating in the 15th annual Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp International Exchange Program during the summer.

Selected for the travel from Farmington and Farmington Hills are violinist Rebecca Goldberg, cellist Lee-Ann Richardson, and violinist Kelly Vroman.

Blue Lake will send four musical groups to Europe this summer, while nine groups from four European countries will visit Michigan.

In addition, Blue Lake will operate two sessions at its satellite camp in southern Germany, called Blue Lake in Bavaria, which attracts students from the United States, Canada and 10 European countries.

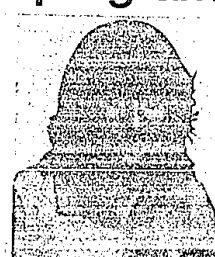
Blue Lake will send 260 musicians and singers to Austria, Belgium, France, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from June 19 to July 16. In return more than 500 members of nine bands, orchestras, choirs, and dance groups from Austria, Germany, Sweden, France and Belgium will visit Michigan from now through August.

Four Blue Lake groups will travel independently while in Europe and stay in private homes in each community they visit. Members of the European

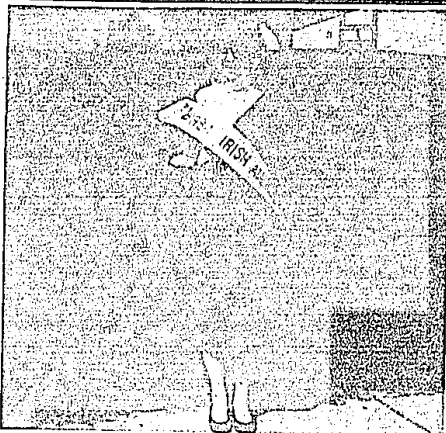
groups do the same while in Michigan. The aim of the exchange is to promote goodwill and understanding among all participating nations through the universal language of music.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR MEETING June 11, 1984

Mayor Williams opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on June 11, 1984 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkatech, Amador, Dolan, Dudley, Sorocum, Williams and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns, Assistant City Manager Costick, Finance Director Roach and City Attorney Bibeau. Minutes of May 14, 1984 were approved as corrected. Minutes of May 21 and 29, 1984 were approved as presented.

The budget for fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984 was adopted setting the millage rate at 8.0 mills (7.7 mills Operating and Debt, 3 mills Capital Improvement). The Council introduced Ordinance No. C-13-84, an amendment to City Code to change the vote necessary to approve a liquor license.

Council approved site plan and open space plan for Green Hill Commons Phase V located in Section 32.

Resolution was adopted amending sewer disposal rates for industrial waste control. Council application was approved for Ruddy's Pizzeria, 31446 Northwestern Highway for June 27, 1984.

Council application was approved for Boco's Shopping Center at 13 Mile and Orchard Lake Road for June 26, 1984.

Council approved application for Fireworks Display for Farmington Founders Festival on July 21, 1984 at Orchard Ridge Campus.

Council directed staff to prepare a report on the possibility of the city dividing city taxes from school taxes.

Council approved a request to fill a flood plain on southeast corner of Orchard Lake and Ravine Road by Brooks and Layne Development Company, Inc.

Council authorized funding to search expenses to expedite 12 Mile Road project. Diamond Automation, 23400 Haggerty Road, was granted a waiver on construction of a front sidewalk for one year.

Council approved employment of Richard Murphy's son, Kevin, as a lifeguard/swim instructor in Parks and Recreation Department.

Council denied Ronald Manning's request for a Taxicab License for Veterans Cab Company.

Council approved the Terrace Shoppe's request for a Tent Sale June 8-10, 1984.

Council granted permission to close Moore Drive between Fleming and Gill Road for a Block Party on June 16, 1984.

Council adopted the Budget for the Fiscal Year 1984-85 and established the millage rate for the General Fund and Debt Service.

Council adopted the proposed Sidewalk Policy submitted by the City Manager at the Council Meeting of May 31, 1984.

Council authorized the City Manager to proceed with the development of a program to replace the east overhang of the Municipal Building.

Council accepted the low bid of Michael Cross Excavating, Inc. of Southfield, Michigan in the amount of \$42,477.70 for the Reparat Street Water Main.

Council approved a split of a vacant parcel on the north side of Oakland Street between Cass and Wilmarth Streets owned by William Bloomer, his sister Mrs. Kilgus and their spouses.

Council granted permission to David Cornwell for one Sunday only to allow workmen to complete construction of a new house, and stipulated that work is not to begin before 9:00 a.m.

Public comments were heard.

Council accepted the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission's 1984-85 Budget as submitted.
