34th year marked with Livonia Spree

HAPPY 34TH birthday, Livonia! It's been 34 years of cityhood, and residents are invited to share in the celebration.

And what a celebration it will be. A championship rodeo, Michael Jackson concert ticket giveaways, bands and a chili cook-off are among the highlights of the six-day Spree beginning Tuesday at Ford Field, Lyndon and Farmington roads.

This year's championship rodeo, possibly the largest of the Spree events, is scheduled for June 21-23. This year's rodeo is sanctioned by the International Pro Rodeo Association. Performance time is 7 p.m. (rain or shine) all three nights at Veterans Park next to the Family YMCA on Stark Road.

The rodeo is produced by the J Bar J and features many of the top names in professional rodeo, competing in saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling, bareback riding, calf roping, cowgirl barrel racing and bull riding.

Of interest to the "younger cowpokes" will be the Michael Jackson tickets to be given away during the inauguration of each rodeo performance. The number on your rodeo ticket will be used for the drawing. The lucky winner will receive two tickets to Jackson's summer concert appearance in Detroit. You must be present to win.

Presale tickets are \$8 for family (one adult and three children or two adults and two children); \$4, adult and \$3 children. At the gate tickets are \$10, family; \$5 adult, \$3 children. Tickets are available in Livonia fire stations, the Livonia Family YMCA and the Livonia Recreation Department.

BASEBALL will be a big feature at this year's Spree with teams playing at various diamonds at Ford Field throughout the entire festival.

And while the ball players compete, Spreegoers who enjoy music and dancing will be taking part in other activities.

A '80s dance, Non-Stop-Bop, is planned from 7 p.m. to midnight Thursday in the Eddie Edgar Arena. A dance contest and a '50s costume contest will be held.

Featured will be the Mod-Kav-Polyesters, the Laredos and a disc jockey. Admission is \$4 per person. Refreshments including pizza, beer, pop and popcorn will be sold.

The Non-Stop-Bop is sponsored by the Livonia Police Officers Association.

To go along with the sight and sounds of the '80s, an old-car exhibit, featuring autos from the fabulous '50s, will be held 6-7 p.m. in front of the arena.

THE ENTERTAINMENT lineup for the week also includes the Starfire Band, a five-piece top-40 rock and dance band. Gary Niemenski, lead vo-

calist for the group, lives in Livonia. The band plays 8-11 p.m. on Friday at the Mobile Stage.

On Saturday, June 23, two bands will perform at the showmobile. From 3 to 5 p.m. Jamie Coe and his band will be featured. Dad and the Boys, a local band comprised of Franklin and Churchill High School grads will play 5-11 p.m.

On to the sounds of the '60s with The Ditties. Music from that decade and their own brand of comedy is what Spreegoers will hear when The Ditties appear 7-10 p.m. Sunday, June 24. The concert precedes the 10 p.m. fireworks display.

Also on Sunday, the award-winning Churchill High School pon pon squad will appear on the mobile stage at 8 p.m.

Also expected to appear at Spree is Miss Livonia, Cindy Evans. She is the daughter of Barbara and Harry Evans

and is attending the University of Michigan. Along with Cindy, the 11 finalists in this year's Miss Livonia competition will be in attendance at Spree.

At 7:45 p.m. Sunday, the Betty Miller Scholarship Award winners will be presented with \$750 checks. The winners are Lisa Marie Timco from Stevenson High School, John Rocco from Franklin High School, Mark Logan Zeck from Clarenceville High School and Jeanette A. McLaughlin from Stevenson.

BUT SPREE is more than music and dancing. The fun will continue with the Livonia Super Chili Cook-off, sponsored by the Livonia Jaycees. This is the second year the cook-off has been in the Spree lineup, and promises to be a "tasty treat" for festivalgoers.

Some 40 cooks will prepare their favorite recipes at 2 p.m. A panel of local judges will select Livonia's top chili cook.

Cooking time is expected to take three to four hours. During which the public is invited to stroll, stroll and savor the aroma of each recipe. Admission is \$2. Chili samples will be sold for \$1.00 each. Chili samples will be sold for \$1.00 each.

The chili cook-off is sponsored by the International Chili Society.

The Bavarian Fest is planned for Spree 34 from 6 p.m. to midnight Friday and Saturday in the Eddie Edgar Sports Arena. Admission is \$2.50.

A special feature at this year's Spree is Polish Night on Wednesday, June 20 in the Eddie Edgar Arena. The PLAV (Polish Legion of American Veterans), a Polish-American service organization, will host a night of dining and dancing from 7 p.m. to midnight. The menu will feature such Polish favorites as kielbasa, sauerkraut and pierogies.

Also included in this year's Spree are carnival rides furnished by W.G. Wade shows.

Special family events are planned at 5 p.m. Saturday at the rodeo site near the Livonia Y on Stark Road.

Admission is free and the Spree Committee has planned games and prizes for kids of all ages. Some of the events include a Pribner test, egg toss, sack race and obstacle course.

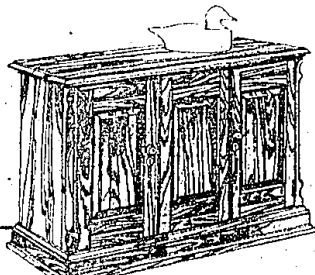
