Catholic Mass offered by the Rev. Alex Brunett of St. Aidan Catholic Church will begin at 8:30 a.m. A Protestant service, conducted by Dr. Bartlett Hies of Ward Presbyterian Church, is slated to begin at 10 a.m. at the mobile stage.

Volunteer drivers will provide shuttle-van service to parking areas adjacent to Livonia City Hall to the Spree site a half-mile away five of the six days.

The vans will pick up and return passengers to the parking areas from 6 p.m. to midnight Wednesday and Thursday of Spree week, and 5 p.m. to midnight Friday, and 1 p.m. to 1 a.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Kroll-Partykula





Kathleen Marie Kroll of Royal Oak and Thomas Arthur Partykula of
