will Le ATTENDING the opening reception of the exhibit at U.M.Dearborn last week, Chihuly found it difficult to describe his wor.

"All my glass is asymetrical," he said. "I work with fire and gravity and centrifical element, I try to bring that out in the glass-blowing process."

Chihuly's art works are the result of a cooperative effort, he said. The artist works with fellow craftsmen who originally were bla students.

"I sometimes compare it to film making, like a director to making a film," he said. "I don't make them by myself."

THE PIECES on exhibit in Dearborn are a variety of shapes and colors, from soft rose to vivid blue. One piece may combine turquoise and brown, rose and gray or pink and white. Others are described as red or purple "with enhancements." The largest work is approximately 23 inches wide. Some pieces are arranged in groupings.

Among those on display are samples from the "matechal" series. "Matechia" is Italian for "spotiety," Child works almost resemble cloth with their folds and flowing lines.

dian blankets, as his "basket" series were inspired by Indian baskets. In making the former, Chihuly rolled cylinders of blown glass over designs resem-bling miniature blankets that he had woven from glass filaments. Two in the exhibit are 5.5 and 18 inches blick.

Chihuly's inspirations for art works come from other works and traveling, he said. The award-winning artist has traveled throughout Europe.

"VOU NEVER duplicate it," be said. I rely a lot on circumstances. I would like to control them, but I can't. You don't know (how a work will turn out) until you're actually done.

"The process is very inspring. We make them the same way they were made 2,000 years ago. It's exciting to see the glass in such an environment." In carlier centuries, glass was so prized that rulers of countries went to extremes to try to keep its secrets. Chichily said.

"No individual artist had the opportunity to work with glass," he said. 'In Italy, artists who left were executed. In England, they were knighted. This studie glass movement didn't get started until 1902."




