A July wedding is planned on the beach of an 1890 vintage estate in Holland, Mich.

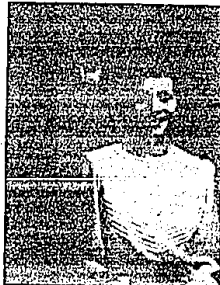


Pietila-Pennala

Glen Oaks, on 13 Mile Road in Farmington Hills (between Orchard Lake and Middlebelt roads), has a superior golf course with cutting facilities.

Groveland Oaks is on Dixie Highway at Grange Hall Road. It has 600 campsites, a sandy beach and a swimming lake, sparkling ponds and three lush islands. Groveland Oaks is a summer paradise for overnight visitors.

Independence Oaks is at 9501 Sashabaw Road, in Clarkston. On this 850-acre site there is a large lake where boating, swimming and endless fun awaits the explorer.

Orion Oaks in Orion Township comprises more than 900 acres in a development stage for camping, sports, and many new ideas.

Road Oaks is on John R near 12 Mile Road in Madison Heights. This site has a gold dome, which is the first of its type in the country for golfers.

SPRINGFIELD OAKS is on Andersonville Road at Hall Road in Davisburg. This prize location attracts art shows, horse shows and golf tournaments. It is interesting every season of the year.

Waterford Oaks is at 3800 Watkins

Lake Road in Pontiac. This gem has an artificial wave pool and in addition has a giant, two-flume water slide that combines rides on winding loops and turns with a refreshing splashdown.

White Lake Oaks is on Williams Lake Road, off M-59. In the winter it offers cross country ski lessons and equipment rental, plus in the summer it has a par-70 golf course. Motorized golf carts plus constant tournaments are among the features that attract all ages.


