RECOVERY FROM ALCOHOLISM

A videotaped lecture by Dr. Russell Smith, entitled "Abstinence," will be featured at Brighton Hospital's next community education program at 6 p.m. Tuesday, July 3.

Smith, Brighton's medical director, frequently lectures at professional and community forums on alcoholism and substance abuse. The taped presentation is from the series he conducts during the hospital's patient education program. In his lecture, Smith notes that drinking alcohol is a learned behavior and discusses some techniques for "unlearning" as part of the recovery from alcoholism.

Following the film, a trained counselor will be available to answer questions and explain what help is available from both the alcoholic and his or her family.
