Maestro Herbig, the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and Entremont will return on Sunday at 8 p.m. for the Lula C. Wilson Memorial Concert and a program of Weber, Mozart and Schumann.
Herbig, music director designate of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, will begin his tenure as music director with the 1984-35 season.
