Destination: Iceland

Eleven-year-olds Rachel Sapala of Birmingham and Felicia Tripp of Bingham Farms are on their way to Iceland to spend a month with youngsters their age from a dozen countries.

Both make faces when they talk about the motion and fits they've been told will be a regular part of their diet, but otherwise they're looking forward to their first adventure away from home and their parents.

"It's exciting," said Rachel Friday, "but it's also scary. You don't know what languages the other kids will be speaking and you don't know what's going to happen."

Felicia said she's looking forward to making friends "that we'll keep on writing to as we grow up. And maybe some day we'll visit them again."

RACHEL AND FELICIA are part of a four-member delegation of youngsters from metropolitan Detroit who will attend a Children's International Summer Village (CISV) in Iceland. Elyce Bomser and Ben Bloom, 11 and 12, and residents of Detroit, are in the delegation. Group leader is Wayne State University student Jude Closson of Detroit.

Similar villages are being held in other parts of the world under the auspices of CISV, a non-profit organization supported by donations and the families of those who participate. CISV has a chapter in Detroit and Detroit is also host for a village beginning later this month.

Village activities include most of those normally associated with a camp program, but the emphasis is on cultural sharing to foster world understanding.

MOST COUNTRIES represented at the Iceland village are from Europe and South, Central and North America. This village's official language will be English, "which means all of the adult leaders are expected to understand English," said Closson. But the youngsters will speak in their own languages.

The camp is non-political and unaffiliated with any religious or social group. The children who attend come from various cultural and social backgrounds; they are selected for their adaptability and leadership traits.

Rachel, a daughter of Nancy Sapala of Birmingham, will begin 7th grade at Covington Middle School in September.

Felicia, who'll be in the 6th grade at Berkshire, is a daughter of Delores and Lucius Tripp of Bingham Farms.

THE DETROIT CISV chapter selected the 100 delegates at a weekend mini camp held at Friends School in Detroit in January.

"We get all the prospective delegates together, simulate the village and watch how they get along with each other," said Closson. "We make the selection from that."

Rachel's mother Nancy Sapala first found out about the CISV program several years ago "from seeing a logo on a sweatshirt," she said. She liked the idea and first sent daughter Amy, then 11 and now 15, to a children's village in Italy. "Amy still remembers going last summer."

Rachel said she's been waiting to go ever since her sister did.

"I'm very enthusiastic about the program," said Nancy Sapala. "It's terrific for young people. Kids come back the same age but more self-assured."


DELORES TRIPP said she's "looking forward to Felicia achieving the goal of more maturity and independence as she approaches being a teen-ager."
