

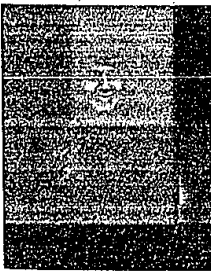
Youth award winner

'Breathing' is class topic

"Learn to Breathe Better," a series of four classes offered by St. Mary's Hospital of Livonia on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, is designed to help people cope with chronic lung disease.

The sessions are offered as a free community service, at 1:30 p.m. in the hospital's fifth-floor classroom, 36475 Five Mile. A new series begins the first Tuesday of each month.

The series begins with "Understanding Chronic Lung Disease," which gives the characteristics of the disease and advice on how to stop smoking.

"Lifestyle Modification" tells how to minimize breathing problems through lifestyle changes, and gives exercises to improve breathing.

The class called "Medications" is given by a pharmacist who explains the effects of different medications and how to take them safely.

The class called "Diet Modification" is given by a dietician who tells how what you eat affects your breathing.
