Voters in Oakland County and across Michigan will go to the polls Tuesday, Aug. 7, to nominate candidates in Dem-ocratic and Republican primaries for partisan offices.
These include U.S. senator, U.S. rep-

resentative, state representative, Oak-land Quonty administrators, Oakland County commissioners and township offices.

Winners of primaries will square off in the Nov. 6 election, when they will be joined by "minor party" candidates. (Minor parties pick their candidates at conventions.)

VOTERS ALSO will nominate candidates for nonpartisan district judge in districts where more than two persons filed for a single post. And they will decide whether to re-new for another five years an Oakland County parks and recreation property tax of a quarter-mill (25 cents per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation.)

TRANSPORT OF

Despite solar crash syc. redistricting, voters will find themselves in the same state House of Representatives districts as in 1982. If you have a question about which congressional, legislative or county commissioner districts a you live in, contact your local city or township clerk.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. You need not declare your party affiliation, and you may vote in either party's primary — but not in both. If you attempt to vote in both parties' primaries, your ballot can be invalidated.
